

## **Understanding MyWiley Early Alert**



Faculty and staff flag concerns such as low grades, attendance issues, missing assignments, etc.

#### **Alert Processing**

Alerts are sent to advisors or intervention teams for follow-up.

Students receive personalized outreach, including emails, meetings, and resources.

## **Steps to Complete Early Alert**




### Log in to the Wiley platform:
